Career Investigation

This unit introduces the skills of career research and planning. Students should be encouraged and facilitated to actively investigate careers related to their aptitudes, interests and choice of Leaving Certificate subjects, with particular reference to their selected vocational subjects.

Specific Learning Outcomes

The student should be able to:

- identify personal aptitudes and interests
- investigate a range of careers appropriate to personal aptitude and interests
- identify and analyse the aptitude and skills required to pursue a specific career
- describe relevant qualifications and training required for entry to the selected career
- identify available opportunities to pursue a selected career locally, nationally, and where possible, at international level
- plan and set up an opportunity to interview and/or work shadow a person in a selected career
- integrate information from a variety of sources to prepare a final report on a career investigation
- reflect on and evaluate the experience of undertaking a career investigation
- link the activities in this unit to learning in relevant Leaving Certificate subjects.


