The 'nudge' effect of influences



There are a number of famous actors who came from the industrial town of Port Talbot. Arguably, because formidable hell-raising superstar Richard Burton set the tone, and inspired locals such as Anthony Hopkins, Michael Sheene, and performer Rob Brydon.

There was an expectation that young people from Port Talbot could act.


What you're good at

being a good listener.






Circle two: What you love

The things you love can help you determine experiences where you really thrive, such as being in a lively setting, collaborating, or being out in the countryside.






Circle three: What lifestyle you want

Consider what matters to you most in life – family, work, socialising, personal interests, being active, money, structure, flexibility?






Circle four: What the world needs

Based on their answers, write a report for your partner with recommendations about the type of job or industry you could see them in, and why.






